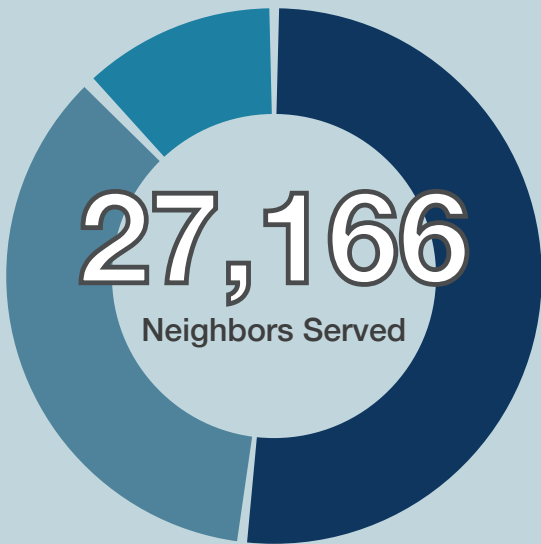

It used to be that about 70 percent of low-income households were located in Chicago and the other 30 percent were in the suburbs. Now it's about 50/50.

HELPING FAMILIES

52% of our families have kids under 18

- Families can visit our food pantries twice each month and choose the foods that work for their own tastes and lifestyle.
- Summer Science Programs for kids boost interest in STEM subjects and offer a great way to keep kids learning all year.
- Kids with birthdays receive cake-making supplies and a gift bag. Families with a new baby are given a layette bag with diapers, clothing, toys and books.

HELPING SENIORS

12% of our clients are seniors

- With our free-choice food pantry, seniors can select their own fresh produce, lean proteins and nutritious grains.
- Our Computer Training Program offers free classes in computer skills and software, including Microsoft Word, Excel and PowerPoint.
- For those looking for a great way to express themselves and meet new people, we offer a variety of Art Programs.



TEN COMMUNITIES WITH HIGHEST NUMBER OF HOUSEHOLDS VISITING PRC

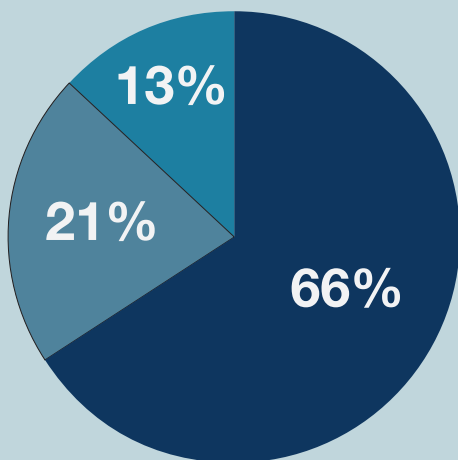
